



# TST LANGUAGE EXAMINATIONS

*French, German, Greek, Hebrew, Italian, Latin, Spanish*

- **Time:** All language exams will be held throughout the course of the day on Friday January 26, 2024. Students registered for an examination will be informed of their precise language examination time at least one week in advance of the examination. All exams have a duration of one and a half (1.5) hours. Please arrive 15 minutes prior to the start time.
- **Remember to bring:** Pens (exams must be written in **black ink**, not pencil), your student photo ID, and, if applicable, your payment receipt.
- **Fee and Payment Options:** Exams taken by registered TST students to fulfill program language requirements are not subject to a fee (first attempt only). The fee for all other exams, including all exams taken to fulfill admission requirements, is \$42 per exam. PayPal is the method of payment. - **Registration:** To register, please do so via the online registration form by **12 noon on Friday, January 19, 2024**, and provide a photo of the dictionary/lexicon of choice. All dictionaries/lexicons must be approved by the GCTS beforehand. If applicable, the exam fee must be paid in full by this date. If your supervisor has indicated that you require a language exam that is **not** listed above, please contact the Graduate Coordinator by **12 noon on Friday, January 19, 2024**.
- **Dictionary:** You may use a bilingual dictionary or lexicon (e.g., French/English, Greek/English). In addition, if your first language is not English, you are allowed to use a second lexicon (English/your first language). You must bring your own approved lexicon(s), which must be clean of all notes/annotations. No other aids, including computerized lexicons or digital devices of any type, are permissible.
- **Grades Required to Pass:**  
French, German, Greek (non-biblical), Italian, Latin, Spanish: B-  
Hebrew and Greek, competency (biblical) and proficiency: B+
