- Two examinations may be taken (two different languages). The 2nd examination begins at **11:45am**.

EXAM DETAILS:

The time limit for each exam is **one and a half hours** (90 minutes). Please arrive on time and bring your own paper and pen. Exam booklets will be provided.

You may use a bilingual lexicon/dictionary (e.g., French-English, Greek-English), **except** in the case of proficiency exams in Greek or Hebrew (see below). In addition, if your first language is something other than English, you are allowed to use a second lexicon (English / your first language). You need to bring your own lexicon(s). No other aids (including computerized lexicons) are allowed.

Competency exams are available in all seven languages. **Proficiency** exams (for students entering the Biblical Department) are available for Hebrew and Greek.

Exam preparation for Greek and Hebrew:

- **Competency examination in Greek** (either competency or proficiency): prepare Mark 1-3.
- **Competency examination in Hebrew**: prepare Genesis 1-2 and 1 Samuel 24-25.
- **Proficiency examination in Greek**: prepare Mark 1-3 and Galatians 1-3, and come prepared to translate any passage from these chapters *without* the aid of a lexicon, to parse selected words and to comment on grammar and syntax.
- **Proficiency examination in Hebrew** should prepare four chapters of Hebrew Prose (Gen 1-4) and four chapters of Hebrew Poetry (Exodus 15:1-21; Psalms 7, 24, 46) and come prepared to translate any passage from these chapters *without* the aid of a lexicon, to parse selected words and to comment on grammar and syntax.
