

TST LANGUAGE EXAMINATIONS

French, German, Greek, Hebrew, Italian, Latin, Spanish Friday, January 30th, 2026

■ Time: All language exams will be held throughout the course of the day on Friday, January 30th, 2026. Students registered for an examination will be informed of their precise language examination time at least one week in advance of the examination. All exams have a duration of one and a half (1.5) hours. Please arrive 15 minutes prior to the start time.

- Remember to bring: Pens (exams must be written in black ink, not pencil), and your student photo ID.
- Fee and Payment Options: Starting January 2025, TST no longer charges for language exams.
- Registration: To register, please do so via the online registration form by 12 noon on Friday, January 9th, 2026, and provide a photo of the dictionary of choice. All dictionaries must be approved by the GCTS beforehand. If your supervisor has indicated that you require a language exam that is not listed above, please contact the GCTS office by 12 noon on Monday, January 5th, 2026.
- **Dictionary**: You may use a bilingual dictionary (e.g., French/English, Greek/English). In addition, if your first language is not English, you are allowed to use a second dictionary (English/your first language). You must bring your own approved dictionary(s), which must be clean of all notes/annotations. No other aids, including computerized dictionaries or digital devices of any type, are permissible. Please email a picture of your chosen dictionary to the GCTS office by **Friday January 23rd, 2026**, for approval.
- Grades Required to Pass:

French, German, Greek (non-biblical), Italian, Latin, Spanish: B-Hebrew and Greek, competency (biblical) and proficiency: B+

Please note that these are only intended to give students a sense of the type of texts that may be used. Examiners are not obliged to follow the format of these samples. Students taking Hebrew, Greek, or Latin exams can expect that the exam will draw from the following range(s):
 - Non-Biblical Greek: John 1-5
 - Biblical Greek
 - Competency: Mark 1-4
 - Proficiency: Galatians 1-3 and 1 Corinthians 7
 - Hebrew
 - Competency: Genesis 1-2; 1 Samuel 24-25
 - Proficiency: Genesis1-4; Exodus 15:1-21; Psalms 7, 24, 46
 - Latin: Augustine's De Trinitate
